Letter from the Chairman

2013 marked an important milestone for EDAMA with considerable growth in membership and executive team capacity. Membership growth in EDAMA from 46 to 68, with a diversity of members from the banking, telecom, and EWE sector is a testament that the Jordan's EWE challenges touch all segments of the economy, and that the role of EDAMA could not be more important at this time. During the course of the year, EDAMA's board of directors elaborated a strategy focused on the following:

- **Policy Advocacy and Mainstreaming.** 2013 has also marked many milestones for the EWE sector in Jordan, most notably in the area of renewable energy, where the government has progressed many proposals from round 1 of the expression of interest process, all be it very slowly. Furthermore, regulations and projects utilizing net metering and wheeling where progress. EDAMA played a critical role in the lobbying for the regulations and the progress of the first round of PPAs, despite many difficulties regarding the tariff structure.
- **Sector Capacity Building and Training.** The Jordan Energy Chapter's activities in training and certifying 55 engineers (Certified Energy Managers, and Renewable Energy Professionals). It is our goal to further support the JEC's activities. EDAMA also contributed to the development of the renewable energy VTC center plans in Ma'an.
- **Value added Membership Services, Business Development and Networking.** A number of high powered events were organized which provide networking opportunities and knowledge sharing for our members.
- **Innovation, Awareness Raising & Alliance Building.** Among the key accomplishments was the launch of the Fefa community outreach project sponsored by the Arab Potash Co., which we aim to replicate in the future. Other project.
- **Organizational Excellence and Knowledge Management.** EDAMA is striving to develop institutional capacity to respond to the growing needs of the sector. EDAMA's core team comprises of a membership officer, communication officer, and a business development officer working in unisent with the CEO.

Key issues that were addressed:

- PPA negotiations and deliberations with NEPCO, ERC, MEMR and the round 1 development.
- Facilitated several meetings for round 1 wind projects
- Review and advocacy for net-metering regulations.
- Addressing revised customs on EE and RE products and services.
- Participated in developing/facilitating position paper with Mubadra (Parliament committee members)



Capacity Building and Training

- Jordan Energy Chapter trainings for 55 engineers
 - CEM/ May 2013
 - REP/ November 2013
- General assembly for the JEC where a new Board and Chairman were elected. EDAMA-JEC was awarded a certificate for Best Annual meeting by AEE
- Training needs assessment concluding the following needed training activities:
 - Solar thermal water heating
 - PV installation
 - Safety in water treatment
- Solar Water Heater sector needs and assessment study.
- Participation in Maan RE VTC project steering task force; a model for the RE VTCs across the kingdom.
- 5 days training for Solar Systems (Fundamentals, Installation, Testing & Commissioning) in cooperation with SMA, 45 participants were certified.



Innovation, Awareness Raising & Alliance Building

- Launched the Fefa CSP project with the sponsorship of the Potash company comprising of more than 60kWp. The projects was supervised by NERC and executed by an EDAMA member.
